RUBENSTEIN AUDITIONS IT

**BAR LUCE**Milan, Italy
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WALKING INTO BAR Luce feels like stepping onto a film set. Of course it does, as this the only bar in the world designed by Wes Anderson, and he's brought his trademark palette and dreamy aesthetic to life with an auteur's eye.

I sit down at a diner-style green Formica table and note how perfectly it's offset by the glossy, baby-pink floor. Bow-tied waiters in tight white shirts could be choreographed movie extras. A jukebox and two pinball machines are placed just-so against one wall, while another is lined with jars of brightly coloured candy. Arched ceilings sport patterned wallpaper

cool and made to stare at.

Bar Luce is in Fondazione
Prada, the fashion house's art
space in the industrial district.
In the Milanese tradition, it's as
much about café food as it is chic
cocktails. Panini, tiny tartines and
pastel-toned patisserie – think
creamy doughnuts – in a cabinet
make the perfect accompaniment
to an afternoon espresso.

At dusk, the bar comes alive, with Wes-seekers and fashion-wearers descending for aperitivi.
The aperitivo Luce – gin, Campari, Zucca rhubarb aperitif and orange bitters – looks delightful.
Nothing says "hot Italian evening" like a cooling aperitif, so with an Aperol number, and a tomato and anchovy bruschetta, I picture myself in a Wes Anderson movie, whimsically stirring my drink while Bill Murray raises a droll eyebrow at the next table. fondazioneprada.org
